WCA will once again be offering summer camps this year! Class sizes will be limited, so please register early. Registrations will be taken first-come, first-served until slots are filled. You may register for as few or as many weeks as you would like. Full-time Camp hours are 7:00 am -5:30 pm, Monday-Friday with core camp hours from 9:00 am -1:00 pm. Core Camp hours are when all "thematic" activities will take place. June 19 and July 4 will be observed as holidays. The daily schedule will consist of academic instruction, hands-on craft activities related to the theme, outside play time, and quiet time. We hope to be able to offer some field trips for older students as well. Summer Camps will run from June 3-July 26 (no camps the week of Memorial Day or the week before school starts).

# **COST OF CAMP**

Core Camp (9:00-1:00) is \$80 per week per child. Full Time Camp (any hours outside of core hours) is \$120 per week per child. Full Time Camp includes core camp hours.

To register, please fill out a registration form and return to the WCA office with a non-refundable deposit of \$20 per week per child to hold your spot. The balance will be billed June 3 for June camps and July 1 for July camps. Tuition is due by the 10<sup>th</sup> of each month.

#### Week 1, June 3-7 Nonfiction Stories

Severe infractions or when the safety of a student/students is involved will result in immediate referral to the administrator. Students suspended or expelled due to behavior infractions will not receive a refund of any deposits paid.

Balance of \$60 for core camp/\$100 for full time per week is due by the 10<sup>th</sup> of each month. Fees may be paid in advance by check, cash, PayPal (wiregrassca@entercomp.com), Venmo (Sandra-Turner-104) or credit card (3% fee for processing credit cards).

I understand that the \$20 deposit is non-refundable unless Wiregrass Christian Academy is unable to fulfill its obligation to have camp. In the event that WCA must cancel a camp session(s), the deposit paid will be credited to the child's account or refunded if the child will not be returning to WCA in the future. I agree to keep my child at home if they are feeling unwell. I will not return my child to WCA until they have been fever free WITHOUT THE AID OF MEDICATION for 24 hours following an illness.

I understand I must give notice at least 48 hours in advance if my child will not be attending a camp for which they are registered. Failure to give notice will result in you being charged for the entire camp fee as teachers will already be in place to work.

Failure to adhere to these policies will result in your child being disenrolled from all summer camps and forfeiture of any deposits paid.
